CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE.

Increased Numbers of Children and Young People in Care

Numbers of children and young people in care in Cambridgeshire are significantly above what would be expected were we to be in line with our statistical neighbours. Numbers have mostly remained fairly steady over the last 12 months or so, at around 700. However, in the lead up to the school summer holidays they have increased to above 720. This is clearly of concern, although an increase around this time of year is not uncommon and has been managed back down over following months. There are a number of short and long term responses in place to manage demand and restrict overall numbers while ensuring that children and young people are appropriately protected from harm. There are also a number of actions in place to manage unit costs of placements so that financial risk to the local authority are minimised as far as possible.

CONSULTATION ON CHANGES TPO PROVISIONS OF INPATIENT BEDS FOR PEOPLE WITH LEARNING DISABILITIES EXTENDED.

Cambridgeshire and Peterborough CCG has extended the closing date for the 'Community First' consultation on proposed changes to the provision of inpatient beds for people with a learning disability in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. The closing date has been extended to **5pm on Friday 12 October 2018**.

People with a learning disability and/or autism have the right to the same opportunities as anyone else; to live satisfying and varied lives and to be treated with dignity and respect.

Like everyone else, people with a learning disability and/or autism should be able to expect to live in their own home or another place of care within their local community, to develop and maintain positive relationships, and to receive the support they need to be healthy, safe, and an active part in society.

Our aim is that hospital admissions for people with a learning disability should be a last resort, of high quality, integrated with community services, and focus on people's recovery so that they can be discharged back to the community in a timely way.

To do this we are planning to redesign inpatient services and to invest in community and primary preventative services for people with a learning disability and/or autism.
